



## **Club Circular**      **June 2006**

### **Junior (U-21) Celtic Cups**

You may already be aware that over 30<sup>th</sup> June to 2<sup>nd</sup> July, Wales are hosting this bi-annual tournament at Sophia Gardens, Cardiff. Entry fees are very reasonably priced at £5 per day or £10 for a three day ticket with matches taking place at 10:00, 12:00, 14:00 and 16:00 daily. With all U-16's being allowed free entry at all times we hope that clubs and schools will take the opportunity of coming along to see some excellent hockey. We are extremely grateful to Worldwide Sports Insurance UK Ltd for their financial backing of the tournament. This tournament is a warm up for the various EuroHockey tournaments to be held over 23<sup>rd</sup> – 29<sup>th</sup> July with our Men playing in Gibraltar in the Trophy while our Women play against the likes of Germany and England in the Championship in Catania. In other EuroHockey events our U-16 squads are participating in Trophy tournaments in Zagreb over 9<sup>th</sup> – 15<sup>th</sup> July (Boys) and Prague over 10<sup>th</sup> – 15<sup>th</sup> July (Girls).

### **WHU Modernisation**

You will probably also be aware that the WHU has been without a CEO since January. You may have seen recent press & web adverts but unfortunately at the end of the process it was not possible to appoint anybody. The Board are still actively seeking a new Chief Executive Officer and in the interim the Board will be taking on extra responsibility for the day-to-day operation of the company. Dave Skirrow has also decided, for personal reasons, to concentrate on his own club and in the meantime, the role of Chairman will be covered by Anne Ellis, John Turton and Karen Evans.

### **Database**

Although it has taken longer than anticipated to complete the new WHU registration database it will be ready for the new season. Full details will be issued in the next circular at which time club secretaries will be able to update and amend their own club's member's details on-line. Clubs will have the option (through their club password) to use the system as their own club notice board. Individual members will also be able to access the system to update their own information, again through individual passwords.

## **EuroHockey Tournaments**

Our congratulations go to Swansea LHC for retaining their place in the Club Champions Trophy division with particular congratulations to Cardiff HC who after some hard matches earned promotion from the Challenge division of their own EuroHockey Club Champions tournament. ### **Handbook**

In order that the 2006/7 version can be issued at the very beginning of next season please ensure that the enclosed return is completed and returned by 30<sup>th</sup> June. You will note a few differences from previous years and I would ask that you ensure that all areas are completed.

### **Club Child Protection Officers (CCPO's)**

A number of scUK courses have been held over the past two months with over 100 members having received training not only in Child Protection procedures but also Criminal Record Bureau (CRB) checks. One course is still to be held to cater for Mid-Wales clubs which will be held during the summer period. Only those clubs with trained CCPO's will be authorised to order CRB forms so if your club do not have such an officer as yet please contact the WHU office so that alternative arrangements can be made. It is likely that this role will become a compulsory part of any clubs membership of the WHU so please act now! For those who have completed the training, full details of the web-based Child Protection 'packs' will be forwarded to the lead officer in each club over the next few weeks. Please ensure that the CCPO detailed on the club officers' return (as detailed above) has completed the training.

### **Summer Hockey Camp**

After the very successful Camp in Swansea last year the WHU have decided to repeat the experience this year over 1<sup>st</sup> – 3<sup>rd</sup> August. The Camp is open to anybody aged 11-15 as at 1<sup>st</sup> September 2005. The Camp costs £110 per person and includes 2 nights full board. A leaflet detailing the 'experience' is enclosed and I would ask that it is passed around all of your younger members. It will be the first time that the match has been held off the mainland of either England or Wales and all support will be gratefully appreciated by Manager Rob Riley, Coach Andy Jones and all the squad.

### **Vets Internationals**

The first over 45 & over 55 Men's Vets internationals will be taking place this coming weekend (24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup> June) in Swansea. With both Welsh teams facing England the matches are likely to be hotly contested. For further information please visit the Welsh Hockey Union website. Our over 40 & over 50 Vets will also be hosting their own Home Nations tournaments, again in Swansea over 26<sup>th</sup> & 27<sup>th</sup> August.

### **Gender Equality**

The Government intends to introduce regulations next autumn making it an offence to discriminate on the above grounds in the provision of goods services or facilities. It appears whilst single sex clubs will be permitted to continue - (provided they are activities which persons may reasonably wish to pursue on a single sex-basis such as sports) - there should be no discrimination in membership services or facilities offered to both sexes and regardless of sexual orientation. For example Clubs and Associations will not be able to include sexual orientation as a membership criterion. Simply having a discriminatory practice will itself be an offence even though there may not be an actual victim. There could well be an issue on the quality of e.g. changing rooms & other facilities in some cases. For further information please contact Chris Brewer at the Welsh Hockey Union office.

### **Cancelled /Suspended Memberships**

Regretfully it is sometimes necessary to suspend or cancel some individuals' membership of the WHU for a number of reasons. If you wish to check that any new member of your club is eligible for registration please contact Chris Brewer at the WHU office.

### **Public Liability & Personal Accident Insurance**

Surprisingly a number of telephone calls are still received by clubs enquiring about taking out their own public liability insurance. To clarify any misunderstandings, all **registered** members of the WHU are covered for public liability and basic personal accident insurance. Through our insurers, WWSI (Worldwide Sports Insurance Ltd), clubs have the option of taking out enhanced

cover, including loss of earnings. Although the additional insurance is subject to the whole club being covered, the premiums negotiated are extremely competitive. As an added option, clubs can insure their kit, cups and trophies with full details available on our website. If anybody wishes to receive hardcopy versions of the insurance cover available, please contact the office.
